

New features revealed as historical gardens light up once again for Christmas

SPECTACULAR SEASONAL **SHOW AT HILLSBOROUGH CASTLE AND GARDENS RETURNS**

A dusting of seasonal magic will land throughout Hillsborough Castle and Gardens as the Christmas at Hillsborough Light Trail makes its return this December.

Over a million lights and seasonal sounds will once again fill the air at the historical venue, where glittering tunnels of light, dancing lakeside reflections and trees drenched in jewel-like colours will come to life amongst a trail of larger-than-life illuminations where mistletoe memories will be made.

This year, the stunning Neon Strings installation has been renamed by Beechlawn in Hillsborough School as Royal Aurora, a nod to the school's home of Royal Hillsborough and the mesmerising Northern Lights mostly enjoyed in the wintertime.

Further highlights for 2022 include Butterfly

Effect. by Masamichi Shimada, courtesy of Light Art Collection. Masamichi is an artist from Japan, who through this artwork, portrays how something as delicate as a butterfly can hold a huge amount of power.

The artist wishes to make visitors smile through the creativity of his work and

aims to emphasise that the small act of one person can make a huge difference to

Mourne Wall restoration progress allows earlier start on Slieve Donard repairs

The NI Water Mourne Wall Restoration Project team is making good progress with the £2.5m phase two schedule of repairs and plans to start works on Slieve Donard this month.

construction team led by GEDA and encompassing local stonemasons from Thomas Rooney & Sons, has completed more than 65 repairs on Slieve Muck and Slievenaglogh South since August and as a result of mild weather conditions will move to Slieve Donard earlier than expected.

Speaking about the work, Michael Donnelly, Senior Project Manager with NI Water said: "The stone for the repairs on Slieve Donard has been bagged and is sitting in Binnian Quarry ready to be transferred by helicopter to the required locations on Slieve Donard. With favourable weather

conditions presently, the team plans to start transporting the bagged stone and getting repairs on Slieve Donard underway in November.

"NI Water would ask the public to be mindful of the ongoing work to restore the 100-year-old Mourne Wall and the possibility of helicopters being in the area for a short period. As always, any helicopter lifts will be carefully managed, with stewards and signage in place for health and safety purposes."

"As this important project continues, I would like to thank Mourne Heritage Trust, NIEA, National Trust and the Trustees of Mourne for their

ongoing guidance and assistance and acknowledge the strenuous efforts exerted by the contractors and wider project team in carrying out this vital work."

Around 75 repairs have been identified for the section of wall on Slieve Donard with work expected to take around 6-8 weeks depending on weather.

At the heart of the phase two programme of repairs – being managed on behalf of NI Water by RPS – is a proactive 'stitch-in-time' approach which will see the careful dismantling and rebuilding of vulnerable bulges in the 22milelong wall to aid its longevity.

With most people starting to count down to the festive season, the charity Air Ambulance NI is encouraging the public to remember the air ambulance service.

When most of us will be off work and enjoying time with family and friends, the Helicopter Emergency Service will continue every day.

During the month of December, the HEMS anticipate being called upon on over 60 occasions. Behind every one of those calls is a patient who is critically ill or injured. The doctor and paramedic team bring the hospital direct to the patient, providing critical care at scene that can be the difference between life and death. It's a service we all hope never to need, but is good to

to need, but know it is there.

O'Rorke, Operational Lead of HEMS said, "As we come into the winter season the profile of missions starts to reflect the time of year and people's activity. For example, we may be called out to less sporting accidents at this time of year but more road traffic collisions. Whatever has caused the critical

emergency our commitment to the public is to be there, day in, day out to look after the people Northern Ireland. The doctors, paramedics and medical equipment is the provision and governance of the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service (NIAS), but it's never taken for granted by our team the support from the public that enables us to fly to the sickest people who need us, on average twice per day." The charity has many

The at-home test that can spot diabetes in society's most vulnerable

ROUTINE eye tests can help detect diabetes and other health conditions before symptoms start to show, according to experts.

In the lead up to people have regular World Diabetes Day eye tests to ensure that (14 November), advice was offered by Specsavers' Home Visits service, which sees opticians travelling across the country to provide full and thorough eye tests for those who are unable to visit their opticians unaccompanied due to illness or disability.

Diabetes and your eyes

Here, Graham explains more about diabetes and your eyes.

'A complication of diabetes is diabetic retinopathy which can occur when high blood sugar levels over a long period of time damage the blood vessels in the back of the eye, explains Graham. 'If left untreated it can cause sight loss. In its early stages diabetic retinopathy usually doesn't cause any noticeable symptoms, so an eye test can pick it up before you do.

the condition



affects small vessels blood the eye, damaging the retina, your optometrist can look for early characteristic changes, such tiny leaks from these damaged vessels.

Graham says: 'As retinopathy develops, vessels can blood weaken, bulge or leak into the retina and can be referred to non-proliferative However, retinopathy.

if it worsens, some vessels can close off which causes new ones to grow, or proliferate, on the surface of the retina. This is known as proliferative retinopathy and can lead to problems with your vision and even sight loss.'



HOSPITAL ROOKS

Back in October, I spent a few days in the Ulster Hospital for tests (I'm now doing OK, thank you, and the staff were wonderful) where I was privileged to watch how rooks, possibly the ugliest of crows but also possibly the smartest, carried out their communal practices in preparation for overnight roosting.

I was on the 6th floor of the new building with a fantastic picture window view over the old hospital buildings to the Castlereagh Hills, and it was on my second morning I noticed the flying from somewhere out sight, possibly in the grounds of Knock Golf Club or the lower Stormont Estate, obviously their overnight roost.

Remembering how Mark Cocker in his brilliant book, Crow Country, described how rooks prepare for roosting, I decided to keep watch, but it wasn't until two days later that I was able to

see the spectacle, from about 5.30pm.

First, a few, maybe 20 or 30 gathered on a small car park, a strange place just stand or strut about, before rising up together, clearly knowing their destination, to head for a stand of mature trees below the Maternity Wing, settling in the branches, and to be joined soon by others, more and more, until, as though signaled, again, they flew up and away from the trees to land on the old hospital roofs and railings.

I had this image in my head of a Sergeant Major Rook, an Officer Rook, a Head of the Clan Rook getting ready to order the troops forward, but initially the movement towards the roost was slow, but steady, one roof to another, and it wasn't until the very edge of darkness that somehow, from somewhere, came the moment, and the huge flock rose as one, a black on black chaotic but preordained, and



purposefully headed the place where they'd roost overnight safety, ready to

disperse at dawn to feed and later do it all over again.



Christmas facts you may not have known

There are many Christmas traditions we all generally know of but there are also a number of lesser known Christmas facts some of which you may have heard . The following are a few interesting and bizarre facts.

There are around 60 million Christmas Trees grown in Europe every year. They are usually grown for fifteen years before they are sold. The tallest Christmas tree was 221 ft which was placed in a Washington shopping Mall in 1950. Parts of the Christmas tree can actually be eaten as they contain a high source of vitamin C. The first artificial tree was made in Germany using dyed goose feathers.

During the First World War troops sang Christmas carols on Christmas Eve even coming out of their trenches to wish each other a 'Merry Christmas' and sharing gifts which became known as the Christmas Truce of 1914. Christmas dinner once consisted of a Pigs head instead of Turkey, the new feast day tradition evolved when turkey became a much cheaper alternative.

Rudolph was created

in 1938 as a part of an ad campaign, the supposed misfit of all the reindeer - just look at what a bit of publicity did for him. Jingle Bells was the first Christmas song to be broadcast in space in December 16, 1965 after it was sang by the astronauts Tom Stafford and Wally Schirra. Scientists took it upon themselves



to create the world's smallest Christmas card in 2010 at 200 x 290 micrometers in size, its small enough to fit on a postage stamp over 8,276 times.

The abbreviation Xmas came from the Greek letter X which is also an abbreviation for

Christ.



THE HISTORY OF THE **CHRISTMAS CARD**

A Christmas card is a greeting card sent as part of the traditional celebration of Christmas in order to convey between people a range of sentiments related to Christmastide and the holiday season.

In 2020 nearly 100 million Christmas single cards were sold and an estimated 900m Christmas cards were sold in boxes and packs, as well as millions of cards bought from online operators, such

Christmas cards are usually exchanged during the weeks preceding Christmas Day by many people. The traditional greeting reads "Wishing you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year". There are innumerable variations

on this greeting, many cards expressing more religious sentiment, or containing a poem, prayer, Christmas song lyrics or Biblical verse; others focus on the general holiday season with an all-inclusive "Season's greetings".

The custom of sending Christmas cards was started in the UK in 1843 by Sir Henry Cole. He was a senior civil servant (Government worker) who had helped set-up the new 'Public Record Office' (now called the Post Office), where he was an Assistant Keeper, and wondered how it could be used more by ordinary

Sir Henry had the idea of Christmas Cards with his friend John Horsley, who was an artist. They designed the first card and

sold them for 1 shilling each. The card had three The outer two panels. panels showed people caring for the poor and in the center panel was a family having a large Christmas dinner! Some people didn't like the card because it showed a child being given a glass of wine! About 1000 were printed and sold.
One of Sir Henry's first Christmas cards, sent to his Grandmother was recently sold at auction for £22,500

As printing methods mproved, Christmas improved, cards became much more popular and were produced in large numbers about 1860. In 1870 the cost of sending Christmas cards, dropped to half a penny. This meant even more people were able to send cards.

The first cards usually had pictures of the Nativity scene on them. In late Victorian times, robins and snow-scenes became popular. In those times the postmen were nicknamed 'Robin Postmen' because of the red uniforms they wore. Snow-scenes were popular because they reminded people of the very bad winter that happened in the UK in 1836.

It 1875, Louis Prang, a printer who was originally from Germany but who had also worked on early cards in the UK, started mass producing cards so more people could afford to buy them. Mr Prang's first cards featured flowers, plants and children. In 1915, John C. Hall and two of his brothers created Hallmark Cards, who are still one of the

biggest card makers today! In the 1910s and 1920s, home made cards became popular. They were often unusual shapes and had things such as foil and ribbon on them. These were usually too delicate to send through the post and were given by hand.

Nowadays, cards have all sorts of pictures on them: jokes, winter pictures, Santa Claus or romantic scenes of life in past times. Charities often sell their own Christmas Cards as a way raising money at Christmas.

also Charities make money from seals or stickers used to seal the card envelopes. This custom started in Denmark in the early 1900s by a postal worker who thought would be a good way for charities to raise money, as



well as making the cards more decorative. It was a great success: over four million were sold in the

THE HISTORY OF CHRISTMAS **FAIRY LIGHTS: HOW DID THE** TRADITION BEGIN?

Originally, Christmas lights were used in Germany in the homes of only the very wealthy as long ago as the 17th century. This was before electricity, and the lights were actually candles.

They were only used on trees at that time, and were strategically placed to illuminate the ornaments that hung from the branches. The candles were held in place by either gluing melted wax to a tree branch or using pins to hold the candle. Around 1900, candleholders were being used, and by 1915 small lanterns and glass balls became a means of holding the candles in place.

Then, in 1882, Thomas Edison's assistant, Edward Johnson, came up with the idea of electric Christmas lights. He lit up a Christmas tree in New York City with 80 small electric bulbs. Within 20 years, stores were displaying electric lights and they were mass-produced and sold to customers. Then, in 1917 there was a tragic fire in New York City there was a tragic Christmas

the largest Christmas lighting company in the world (NOMA Electric Company).

The outdoor Christmas tree that ran on electric lights became very popular throughout North America and the use of them began to regularly take place all over the world shortly thereaf-

ter. Decorating a live Christmas tree outdoors became the attractive thing to do, and many people still do it today. some even going as far as to decorate it as well as they would their own indoor tree.

This slowly evolved into using electric lights on trees not only outdoors, but indoors as well. It also led to the use of lights for houses that everyone uses today. It took many years for Christmas lights to become what they are today, and many ideas inventions lead us to the brightly lit and decorated homes and yards we see every year.

NSPCC Northern Ireland is calling for volunteers to join its Schools Service and visit primary schools to help children understand how to spot and speak out about the signs of abuse.

Last year (2021/22), across the UK, NSPCC's Childline service held more than 14,000* counselling sessions about emotional, physical, sexual abuse and neglect, but counsellors can only provide help and support if the children have knowledge and confidence

to speak out in the first and help children identify

That's why the Schools Service Speak Out Stay Safe (SOSS) campaign is so important and why volunteers are vital to help ensure that every child in Northern Ireland knows how to Speak Out and Stay

With the help of speech bubble mascot, Buddy, SOSS volunteers visit primary schools deliver fun and engaging child-friendly and ageappropriate workshops to help pupils understand and identify the different types of abuse and how to speak out about any issues so they can get help if they need it.

workshops cover these difficult subjects without using any scary words or adult language

a trusted adult they can talk to if they are ever worried about themselves or a friend.

They also learn about Childline and how it can

support them. Last year, more than 55,000 children in Northern Ireland primary schools took part in the Speak Out Stay Safe programme.

"The Speak Out Stay Safe programme began in 2011 and we currently deliver the service to 95% of primary schools in Northern Ireland," says Karen Walker, NSPCC Northern Ireland Schools Service Manager. "Our aim is to have SOSS in all schools.

"You don't have to have had previous experience working with children working with to become a volunteer.

but we do ask that you are over 16, have good communication skills and that you are passionate children's rights about and letting children know about their rights.

"We are looking for volunteers from all over Northern Ireland.

"Full training provided and all we ask is that you commit to at least two workshops a month in schools that are convenient to you.

"The workshops mostly take place in the mornings and last about an hour.

"We know the workshops can have a real impact, because after sessions some children have spoken up and disclosed abuse. That's why it's vital that the service operates at full capacity and why we are appealing for more people to get in touch and find out more about becoming one of our volunteers.

"We currently are running no-obligation information online sessions where you can

hear about the work of an SOSS volunteer, the training and support we offer and ask any questions you may have.



Top up your antifreeze in cold weather

Antifreeze only costs a few pounds, but a frozen and cracked engine costs hundreds to repair. You need a 50-50 mix of antifreeze and water for the winter - this protects your engine down to -34C.

Most modern cars use long-life antifreeze but some types of antifreeze need changing after only 2 years. Make sure you use the right type and check your service schedule.

How to drive safely in snow and ice

The roads can be danger-ous in winter when there's snow, ice or sleet. Our top tip is to take it slow. Stopping distances can be 10 times longer when it's icy. Gentle manoeuvres and slow speeds are the key to safe driving in ice and


