### RADIUS HOUSING SECURES SUSTAINABILITY LINKED FUNDING FROM DANSKE BANK TO SUPPORT FUTURE DEVELOPMENT PLANS

Danske Bank and Radius Housing Association have agreed a new £75m Sustainability Linked Loan package that will support the development of new social and affordable homes across Northern Ireland in the next three years.

Radius Housing said the loan will be used to support investment in up to 500 new homes and to fund the retrofitting and refurbishment of 1.000 other homes to improve energy efficiency.

Radius Housing is a social enterprise which provides housing,

support to over 33,000 homes throughout the island of Ireland. It employs around 1,000 and manages 14,000 properties in 80 towns across Northern Ireland, with a presence in all 11 council areas.

The deal is one of the sustainability

by a Northern Ireland Housing Association. Sustainability-linked lending links the debt costs of a business's finance with its performance against pre-agreed sustainability objectives.

# £550,000 fund now open for Belfast Region 5G projects

A new funding competition is supporting local businesses and industries in the Belfast region to harness the power of 5G and digital technologies to deliver enhanced operations and services.

Organisations can apply for grants of between £50,000 and £100,000 for projects that make innovative use of 5G and other types of advanced wireless connectivity to deliver economic, social, and environmental impacts.

The competition is part of the Belfast 5G Innovation Region (5GIR) programme, led by Belfast City Council's City Innovation Office. Belfast 5GIR is working with businesses, academia, and the public sector to support the adoption of 5G to drive growth in the region's digital economy.

The competition is open to businesses and organisations located in the Belfast Region City Deal council areas: Antrim and Newtownabbey, Ards and North Down, Belfast, Lisburn and Castlereagh, Mid and East Antrim, and Newry, Mourne and Down.

An online information session for interested applicants will take place at 10.30am on Thursday 26 June 2025 and the closing date for applications is 8 September 2025.

It's a strategic foundation for the region's economic growth plans.

"This competition is a great opportunity for businesses and highgrowth industry sectors to combine the unique benefits of 5G with digital technologies, such as IoT, Artificial Intelligence, robotics and immersive applications, to deliver 5G use cases.

"The Belfast 5GIR programme aligns well with the digital innovation ambitions of the Belfast Region City Deal, and I fully expect it to unlock further 5G opportunities across the region in the coming months."

The Belfast 5GIR programme is funded by the Department for

Science, Innovation and Technology as part of its UK 5G Innovation Regions programme which aims to drive economic growth and innovation by unlocking the opportunities presented by advanced wireless connectivity and digital technologies.

Subject to business case approval, the Belfast Region City Deal will contribute up to £250,000 towards the 5G funding competition.

### Oireachtas schools programme looks forward to Ireland's oldest language and arts festival in Belfast

Belfast City Council has joined together with Fís an Phobail to deliver a series of workshops in Irish medium schools during June, highlighting the upcoming Oireachtas na Samhna festival.

Belfast is hosting Ireland's oldest Irish language and arts gathering from 29 October to 2 November at venues across the city.

With just over 150 days to go until its arrival, the council is working with Fís an Phobail, the Irish language network for west Belfast, to encourage young Irish Gaeilgeoirs to get involved in participating and attending the festival.

As the end of the school year approached, pupils at Bunscoil Phobal Feirste, Bunscoil Dhuibh and Gaelscoil na bhFál explored the history of the festival, first held in Dublin in 1897, and learning more about the various events and activities taking place across arts music, sean-nós singing and the spoken word.

# Belfast selected as a global finalist in Bloomberg Philanthropies 2025 Mayors Challenge

Belfast has been selected as one of the 50 finalists of Bloomberg Philanthropies' sixth Mayors Challenge, a competition to spur local government innovation that improves lives in cities around the world.

The sixth Challenge elevates municipalities that have proposed the boldest ideas to bolster essential municipal services. The 50 finalists, selected from more than 630 applications, together hail from 33 countries and represent over 80 million residents.

Belfast will receive \$50,000 (almost £37,000) to prototype an idea, put forward by Belfast City Council, to work with communities and stakeholders to re-imagine the city's network of alleyways and create shared community assets that deliver benefits for local neighbourhoods.

Council staff will also participate in Bloomberg Philanthropies' Ideas Camp in July to hone and test their concept with feedback from experts and fellow peers.

In January 2026, the 25 cities with the most promising ideas will each be awarded \$1 million (£735,000) and operational assistance to bring their proposals to life.

The 630 ideas submitted to the Mayors Challenge reflect some of the greatest public service challenges facing cities today—as well as the creativity that animates local governments across the globe.

A third of U.S. and Canada applicants, for example,



devised solutions addressing housing and shelter. Nearly half of the applicants from Africa proposed upgrades to waste collection and management.

One out of five applicants from the Asia-Pacific region focused on cleaner water, air, and infrastructure, and 22 percent of European applicants sought ways to reduce poverty or enhance social inclusion.

The 50 finalist ideas were selected for their originality, potential for impact, and credible vision for delivery.

Belfast's proposal aims to develop a more strategic, sustainable approach to regenerating 126 miles of alleyways across the city.
Using the fundi

provided by the Mayors Challenge, the council will trial activities to provide additional outdoor space for residents to enjoy, improve wellbeing, increase planting and play spaces, reduce dumping and foster an increased interest in these spaces.

The awards to date across five previous rounds of competition have provided 38 winning cities with funding and technical assistance to realise their ideas for addressing civic issues.

By supporting the replication of the most successful winning ideas, Bloomberg Philanthropies has expanded the impact of the Mayors Challenge to 337 other cities globally, reaching over 100 million residents around the world.

With the expansion of the Bloomberg Cities Idea Exchange, future Mayors Challenge-winning ideas and other locally led solutions supported by Bloomberg Philanthropies will have new potential to scale - serving as models and catalysts for how governments solve problems across the globe.

### Srebrenica Memorial, 30 Years on

The 30th anniversary of the genocide at Srebrenica was marked with an event at Belfast City Hall which included Junior Minister Aisling Reilly MLA, Junior Minister Pam Cameron MLA, Minister of State Fleur Anderson MP, and survivor Azra Omerbegovic.



Belfast City Council hosted the event along Remembering Srebrenica, and guests were welcomed by Lord Mayor, Councillor Tracy Kelly.

The Srebrenica genocide happened in the heart of Europe in July 1995, just The generation ago. 8.372 victims are remembered each year in Bosnia and around the world.

Belfast City Hall was lit up green and white on the evening of 25th June commemorate the genocide and remember the victims.

Omerbegovic said:

# Local sporting heroes honoured at the GolfNow Belfast Sports Awards 2025

Guests at the awards ceremony in City Hall included Olympians, athletes, volunteers and coaches of all ages and abilities from across Belfast.

As well as a host of awards, two athletes were inducted into Belfast City Council's Sporting Hall of Fame – Marissa Callaghan (Football) and Michael Halliday (Football).

achievements and accolades
this year and recognised
all the sport and physical
activity that goes on, in the
city.

Inducted into the Council's Sporting Hall of Fame, Marissa Callahan is a trailblazer in women's football and a dedicated ambassador for sport. Marissa made her international debut for the Northern Ireland women's national under-19 team in 2002 and progressed to earn her senior cap in 2010. She captained Northern Ireland at the UEFA Women's Euro 2022—an historic moment as the team competed in a major tournament for the first time. Marissa retired from international football in 2025 with an incredible 91 caps, leaving behind a legacy that continues to inspire. She was awarded an MBE in The Kings New Years Honours List in 2025.



Also inducted into the Council's Sporting Hall of Fame, Michael Halliday began his footballing career with East Belfast and then he moved to Glentoran, a club he has supported all his life, where he played for 11 years and won numerous trophies. He made his debut towards the end of the 1999/2000 season. Signed as a midfielder, Glentoran manager Roy Coyle soon converted him to centre forward and over the next ten years he made 468 appearances, scoring


141 goals. He won fifteen winners' medals, including three league titles and two Irish Cups.

### **Lizards and Legends**

JV Allister focuses on our only native reptile, The Common Lizard

Legend has it that St. Patrick banished all the snakes from Ireland, but if he had had all the reptiles in mind, he overlooked one, the Common Lizard. Maybe it was hiding under a stone at the time!

In any case, it's our only native reptile, and a very interesting animal.

Like all reptiles. common lizards are cold blooded, relying on external heat to regulate their body temperature, and are often found sunbathing on rocks or sand in the mornings in their known habitat 'hot spots'. mostly in mountainous areas such as the Mournes and Sperrins, even the Belfast Hills, as well as some bogs and coastal dunes.

They might be slow when cold but can run fast when fully heated, which is their main means of escape if birds or mammals try to catch and eat them. But they have another much more cunning plan: they can shed their tails (still wriggling) to confuse predators, and regrow them, even if they're



usually shorter than the originals. A remarkable adaptation for survival of an otherwise vulnerable creature.

also They have adapted to living colder northern regions as they spread through Europe and beyond. Most reptiles, and all birds of course, lay eggs, but our female common lizards give birth to live young. In more southern, climes, common lizards are known to lav eggs.

While their overall numbers here are not

exactly known, it's thought likely that they are in decline, mainly because of habitat loss; and the extensive wildfires this year will have destroyed precious habitat for many years to come, as well as killing many lizards.

Despite their adaptations, they live precarious lives, particularly as weather patterns change and people do stupid things like setting fire to wild places.

Incidentally, St.
Patrick didn't banish
the snakes from

Ireland, for the simple reason that there were none in his time, since before the last Ice Age. Rather, it seems that snakes served as an allegory for paganism, which Patrick 'banished' as he brought Christianity to our shores.

Myths and legends have their place in our folk memories, but we also need to know the stories about our highly adaptable native wildlife, and in the case of common lizards, protect our only native reptile.



### UNVEILING THE WONDERS OF A ROCK POOL

Rock pools are miniature marine worlds, teeming with fascinating life just waiting to be discovered.





Investigating them is a rewarding adventure, but remember to be gentle and respectful of their delicate ecosystems.

Before you begin, check the tide times and only explore during low tide. Equip yourself with a clear bucket or a magnifying glass for a closer look. Approach the pool slowly and quietly to avoid startling its inhabitants.

Begin by observing from a distance. What larger movements do you notice? You might spot small fish darting amongst the seaweed or scuttling crabs hiding under rocky overhangs.

Next, gently peer into the water. Look

for anemones, often resembling colourful jelly blobs, that will retract their tentacles if disturbed. Keep an eye out for limpets and periwinkles clinging to the rocks, and common starfish, sometimes nestled in crevices. If you're lucky, you might even spot a tiny, translucent prawn or a camouflaged blenny.

Remember to touch as little as possible. If you pick something up for a closer look, return it carefully to exactly where you found it. After your exploration, leave the rock pool as undisturbed as possible, ensuring these vibrant habitats continue to thrive for others to enjoy



### AC NOT BLOWING COLD? TROUBLESHOOTING **CAR AIR CONDITIONING ISSUES**

There's nothing quite like the blissful relief of a perfectly functioning air conditioner on a sweltering summer day.

Conversely, there are few motoring frustrations quite as immediate as flipping on your AC, only to be met with warm, stale air. If your car's air conditioning isn't blowing cold, don't sweat it just vet. Often, the issue might be simpler than you think

Before you book a costly garage visit, let's go through some common culprits and troubleshooting steps.
First, The Basics: Check

These Simple Things
Sometimes, the fix is

literally at your fingertips. Check Your Settings:

sounds obvious, ensure your AC is actually switched "on" and the temperature control is set to its coldest setting. Many cars have a separate AC button (often with an "AC or snowflake symbol) that needs to be engaged. Also, confirm the fan speed is up.

Recirculation Mode:

Recirculation Ensure your recirculation "recirc") button is engaged. This mode cools the air already inside the cabin, making it much more efficient than constantly

trying to cool hot outside

Cabin Air Filter: A clogged cabin air filter can severely restrict making your AC feel weak even if it's producing cold air. This is a common maintenance item and relatively easy to replace yourself in many vehicles. your Check owner's manual for its location and replacement instructions. If it's dirty, swap it out and see if that improves airflow and cooling.

Common Issues and What They Might Mean

If the basics are covered, let's delve a little deeper into more specific problems 1. The Air is Only Slightly Cool, Not Cold

This is often the classic sign of low refrigerant (also known as Freon or R-134a). Refrigerant is the lifeblood of your AC system, responsible for absorbing heat from the cabin and releasing it outside. Over time, small leaks can occur leading to a gradual loss of

Troubleshooting:

can buy DIY AC recharge kits from most automotive stores. These kits often include a pressure gauge, allowing you to check the system's pressure and add refrigerant if it's low. Follow the instructions carefully.

Important Note: While a DIY recharge might offer a temporary fix, a professional will investigate why the refrigerant is low, which usually points to a leak. Simply topping it up without addressing the leak means the problem will return.

2. The AC Blows Cold for a While. Then Gets Warm

This intermittent issue can be frustrating and might indicate a few different problems.

Overheating Compressor: Your AC compressor is the heart of the system. If it's working too hard or starting to fail, it might cycle on and off, leading to inconsistent cooling. This can sometimes be due to low refrigerant as well, as the compressor

electromagnetic clutch that and disengages it. If this clutch is faulty, it might not be engaging consistently. You might hear a "clunk" when the AC button is pressed, indicating the clutch engaging. If you don't hear it, or it's an inconsistent sound, that could be a clue.

Electrical Problems: A loose wire, a blown fuse (check your fuse box in the owner's diagram manual), or a faulty relay

could be causing the system to lose power intermittently. 3. No Air (or Very Weak

Airflow) from the Vents If the air isn't blowing at all, or is barely trickling out, even with the fan on high, the problem likely lies with the fan system itself.

4. Strange Noises or Smells When the AC is On

Hissing/Gurgling: This often points to air or moisture in the AC system, or a very low refrigerant

Clicking/Clunking (Loud/

Repeated): This could be a failing compressor clutch or the compressor itself.

Smell: Mustv/Mouldv is usually due mildew growth on the evaporator coil, which gets damp when the AC is running. Specialist cleaning sprays can help, or a professional "AC refresh" service might be needed.

Smell (like Sweet antifreeze): This is serious and could indicate a leaking heater core or coolant leak. Stop driving and

professional help. When

Professional Help

While some issues can be DIY-ed, many AC problems specialist tools, require diagnostic equipment, and the safe handling of refrigerants. Here's when it's definitely time to visit a qualified mechanic:

Refrigerant Repeated Loss: If you've recharged your system and it goes varm again within a few weeks or months, you have a leak that needs to be found and repaired.

Professionals leak detection dves and equipment to pinpoint these.

Compressor Issues: Replacing a compressor is a complex and expensive job that requires professional expertise and specific tools for evacuating and recharging the system correctly.

Electrical Diagnostics: Tracing complex electrical faults (beyond a simple fuse) is best left to technicians with diagnostic

Any Sign of Major Leakage: If you see puddles under your car that aren't water condensation from the AC, or smell unusual odours. get it checked immediately.

You're Uncomfortable Doing It Yourself: AC systems operate under high pressure and contain systems chemicals that need to be handled carefully. If you're unsure, it's always safer to let a professional handle it.

No Obvious Solution: If you've checked the basics and still have no cold air, a deeper diagnostic is needed.

properly functioning conditioning system isn't just about comfort; it contributes to driver alertness bv preventing and heatinduced sluggishness. By understanding these common issues, you can often diagnose the problem yourself, saving time and money. But remember, for complex or persistent issues, a trip to a trusted mechanic will ensure your car's AC is blowing perfectly cold for many summers to come.



9. How much will it cost, and what are the payment terms?

10. What steps do you take to keep your work on schedule and within budget?
