Dfl Investment in Local Roads Around Strangford Lough

Alliance MLA Kellie Armstrong has welcomed the latest round of investment by the Department for Infrastructure (Dfl) into the rural road network around the Strangford constituency.

The Department for Infrastructure's (DfI) latest investment in rural roads, with up coming works at B172 Ballyblack Road East, A20 Portaferry Road, C257 Kir-cubbin Road, A22 Killinchy Road and the previously completed works on the A20 Deerpark Road.

The improvement works, which are now underway, will see much-needed resurfacing and repairs across a number of local routes. While the works will result in some temporary disruption for residents and road users, Ms Armstrong has emphasised that the upgrades are essential for the long-term safety and quality of local infrastructure.

"This investment is welcome and necessary step in addressing the poor condition of many of our rural

roads," said Ms Armstrong "Rural roads like Ballyblack Road East are vital links for residents, farmers, and local businesses, and they deserve the same level of maintenance and care as any urban route." She acknowledged that road users may experience some inconvenience while the works are ongoing, but urged residents to see the benefits that the improvements will bring once complete.

Ms Armstrong added that she will continue to press for further investment in local transport infrastructure to ensure rural communities are not left behind.

Asda colleague praised for helping customers spot 'gift card' scammers

A supermarket security specialist has been hailed for helping customers fight back against mobile phone scammers.

McCandless. security section leader at Asda Newtownards, says he and store colleagues have identified as many as 10 to 15 potential victims in the

past six months.
"We're seeing people receive messages on social media platforms from someone who pretends to be famous," says Harry. "Or it could be someone pretending to be in a relationship with them, someone they've never met.

"Once they've gained this person's trust, they'll say any number of things – that their career is in trouble or they need help for some other reason. We've seen the messages. We've gone through them with our customers, some of whom have been quite vulnerable in one way or another, and they're awful."

Harry, 48, says the most common con he has spotted is one where victims - who he says vary in age, gender and background - are asked to buy gift cards in store, sharing the bar codes with their scammers via social media

He says: "The amounts small.

customers spending a couple hundred on gift cards, even more. In most cases, we can spot it quite quickly simply because the amount people

are spending is a red flag.

"Once we speak to them, we're often able to chat through the details of the scam and advise them to go to the police. It can be very upsetting for some to accept they've been tricked because they've become they've become emotionally involved with the scammer – or the person they thought they were speaking to.

"But for me, it's rewarding thing to do. In one case, a customer we spoke to retrieved around £1,000 following intervention from the police. while another, who believed he was spending £750 on gift cards for a so-called 'girlfriend' in Canada, stopped just short of losing all that money because we felt uncomfortable with that amount, and once we'd spoken to him it became clear this was a scam. He later came back and thanked

us.
"Something like this would have been unheard



of a few years ago, but it's become alarmingly common. We're more than happy to step in and advise when we can if something doesn't feel right for our That's what customers. we're here for."

Alderdice. Andrew General Store Manager at Asda Newtownards, praised Harry for the work he has

said: "We have fantastic colleagues right

across our store who care about our customers. Harry just goes to prove this, stepping in and providing great on the ground support and pointing them to the police if necessary. I've witnessed Harry first hand talking to customers about the possibility they may have been scammed, with customers then returning to thank him. We're incredibly proud of him. Well done

successful completion the programme, the Ballywalter group decided to continue operating as their newly formed knit and natter



Northern Ireland's largest community and civic pride campaign, Live Here Love Here, has announced the return of its Small Grants Scheme for 2025, following a successful year in Ards and North Down Borough Council, where 14 local projects were awarded a total of £32,376 in funding.

Throughout volunteers contributed an impressive 1,554 hours, demonstrating the role of community effort in tackling environmental challenges and promoting local stewardship.

Delivered in partnership with ten local councils the Northern Ireland Executive, Housing Belfast Harbour, and applications for the 2025 Small Grants Scheme are open until August 18. Community and volunteer groups, schools, not-forprofit organisations, and un-constituted are invited to apply, with successful applications awarded grants from £500 to £3,000.

FINDING HOPE IN HEARTBREAK AS SARAH RAISES FUNDS TO HELP GRIEVING PARENTS

Seeking solace in running after the loss of her baby, Poppy, who was born on 2 April 2025, Sarah McGourty laced up to pound the course of the Comber 10k in June to raise funds for the Ulster Hospital's Forget Me Not Focus Group.

Sarah shared how she wanted to take on the challenge as a way of saying thank you to the Bereavement Midwifery Team at the hospital for the exceptional care and gentle compassion she received before and after the devastating loss of

Poppy. Sarah explained how she was in her second trimester of pregnancy with Poppy when it was discovered that her baby girl no longer had a heartbeat during a scan. After losing Poppy, I felt a deep need to give something back to the Bereavement Midwives who supported me so compassionately during such a painful time. That is what inspired me to start running again and to sign up for the Comber 10k as a way to begin raising funds.

"Running became a muchneeded outlet, giving me space to process our loss. I completed all my training runs at Billy Neill Country Park, where the Forget Me Not trees are planted in memory of precious babies. Passing those beautiful trees during each run gave me the strength to keep going," said Sarah

The Forget Me Not Group in the Ulster Hospital Ma-ternity Unit brings together parents who have experi-

enced the death of a child or baby and provides support and connection to families throughout the year.

Sarah continued, "I spent four days in the Ulster Hospital Maternity Unit and during that time, Susan Stitt, one of the Bereavement Midwives, gave me incredible support. She spent time with me before Poppy was born, helping me prepare for the difficult days ahead. Her kindness and the time she gave meant so much, and it truly helped me face what

Sarah added that she did

have done without the support of her husband, Gerard and the Midwifery staff. "Bereavement Midwife, Jacqueline Dorrian, was with me the day after Poppy was born. She sat with me and helped me process the whole experience. Both Susan and Jacqueline were such a great support for me, they are angels on earth, so selfless and experienced."

Through Sarah's fundraising efforts, £900 was raised for the Forget Me Not Focus Group, which will go towards the purchase of a

'cuddle cot' for families who will also be affected by baby loss. "I have now also joined the Forget Me Not group,' said Sarah. "The support I received meant so much to me and my family."

South Eastern Trust. Bereavement Midwife, Jacqueline Dorrian added, "We are so thankful to Sarah for thinking of us and others in her grief. It was an honour and a privilege for me to spend time with Sarah after the birth of Poppy and we really appreciate her and her family's very generous and kind donation

Lord of the Flies

JV Allister asks if the common horse fly is predator or hero?

It's a hot day in late summer some years ago. You're cutting your lawn, or if you're a farmer you're saving late hay or harvesting barley, flies whizzing around your head, attracted to your sweat, and then it strikes, and you yelp. Cleg attack!

you yelp. Cleg attack!

It's likely that clegs as they're known in Scotland and Ulster are in decline, along with other insects through loss of habitat and the impact of intensive farming, but common horse flies as they're properly named, and flies in general, have been around for millions of years, an integral part of our connected environment.

We take flies for granted and sometimes want to kill them if they annoy us, but they're important to our eco system, for instance having emerged as pollinators of plants even before bees evolved.

And they're important to natural recycling. You see, we didn't invent recycling as we know it over the past few decades,

nature has been doing it for eons. Many flies are attracted to decaying matter, animal or vegetable, feeding and laying the eggs that produce larvae.

Without flies, fungi and other organisms that recycle and convert dead and decaying matter, we'd have serious threats to our health and wellbeing.

Incidentally, the

are approximately 150,000 fly species globally, from fruit flies to mosquitoes and bluebottles, so they're not just prolific and necessary to our nature systems, but successful, otherwise they wouldn't be around in such numbers.

But back to clegs aka common horse flies, which are less interested in decaying matter than...blood! While they mostly feed on nectar and plant juices in damp grassy the need blood to produce eggs, and so prey on cattle, and horses of course, and sometimes humans. That annoying bite on your bare wrist, ankle or neck will be painful, but because of the decline in our insect population it will be increasingly rare.

Heroic Northern Irish educators bringing parents to tears - in the best possible way

New research reveals that Northern Ireland's teachers and teaching assistants (TAs) are making an extraordinary emotional and lifelong impact, well beyond the classroom walls.

Three-quarters (75%) of Northern Irish parents they have been moved to tears of joy by something their child's teacher has done. This is significantly higher than the UK average, which is more than half (57%).

study. commissioned by multistore gift card, One4all Gift Cards, also found that three in four (75%) Northern Ireland credit a teacher or TA from their own school days with having had life-long impact on them.

For many, this impact included their educators having boosted their confidence (75%), three-quarters remember (75%)teachers regularly going above and beyond for them.

Current teachers and teaching assistants are just as heroic. In the past year alone, 88% say their child's teacher or TA has stepped up beyond the call of duty, most often by nurturing a hidden talent (29%) or introducing their child to a brand-new topic or culture (29).

When asked what skills the Northern Irish admire, half (50%) said delivering life lessons between maths problems. followed by the power to turn a meltdown into a teachable moment (25%), and having seemingly inhuman patience (13%).

Modern classrooms demand multitasking, with nearly three-quarters (72%) of Gen X parents saying today's educators have to

do more than just teach.

Top of the list? Acting as mentors or personaldevelopment (69%) caregivers for pupils' wellbeing (62%) and emotional support providers (54%) were named as the extra roles teachers and TAs have to juggle.

Despite this. half (56%) of Northern Irish parents



THE FIERY TRANSFORMATION: WHY **AUTUMN LEAVES CHANGE COLOUR**

As summer's verdant embrace loosens its grip, a spectacular transformation sweeps across our landscapes.

The lush greens of trees give way to a breathtaking palette of fiery reds, brilliant ges, sunny yellows, deep purples. This annual display, a hallmark of autumn, isn't just a pretty show; it's a fascinating natural process driven biochemistry and the changing seasons.

The Science Behind the

Spectacle:

The primary player in the green of summer leaves is chlorophyll, the pigment essential for photosynthesis. the Throughout warmer months, trees are busily converting sunlight into energy, and chlorophyll efficiently absorbs light in the red and blue spectrums, reflecting green, which is what we see.

However, as days shorten temperatures drop in autumn, trees begin to prepare for winter dormancy. This preparation involves a gradual shutdown of photosynthesis. With less sunlight and colder conditions, the production of chlorophyll slows down eventually stops. existing chlorophyll then starts to break down, revealing other pigments



that have been present in the previously masked by the dominant green.

These "hidden" pigments

- Carotenoids: These are responsible for the vibrant and oranges. vellows Carotenoids are present in leaves year-round but become visible once the chlorophyll degrades. They are also found in carrots. corn, and bananas.
- · Anthocyanins: These produce striking reds, purples, blues. Unlike carotenoids anthocyanins are not present in the leaves throughout the summer. They are actively

produced in the autumn. particularly when there are warm, sunny days followed by cool, crisp nights (but not freezing). Sugars trapped in the leaves by Sugars cool temperatures and bright sunlight contribute to their formation. The specific hue of red or purple can depend on the acidity of the leaf's

combination of these concentration along factors, environmental the precise colour we see. Some like maples oaks. are renowned for spectacular and oranges due to their

anthocyanins. Others, like birches and aspens, typically showcase brilliant yellows from their carotenoids.

A Last Hurrah Before

The shedding of leaves in autumn is a vital survival mechanism for deciduous trees. By dropping their leaves, trees reduce water loss during the colder, drier winter months when water can be scarce or frozen. It also helps them shed accumulated waste products. The stunning display colour is a beautiful, albeit temporary, farewell to the growing season, preparing the tree for a period of rest before the cycle begins anew






