YOUNG ANTRIM ATHLETES OFF TO A FLYING START IN FLAHAVAN'S LEAGUE

Young athletes from across County Antrim have competed at the first round of the Flahavan's Athletics NI Primary School Cross Country League, which took place at Antrim Forum.

Competing in the individual Charlie McCann from Moneynick Primary School, Antrim took home the top spot in the first boys' race, followed by John Gilbert from Wallace Prep Primary Lisburn in second place, and Joel Leeburn from Meadow Bridge Primary Hillsborough School, in third

In the second boys' race of the day, Stranmillis Primary School pupils Eimhin and Hugo Lowry came in first second place respectively, followed by Harry Davidson in

Gaining first place in the first girls' race

was Kiyomi Tosh from Templepatrick Primary School, Ballyclare, followed by Victoria Prep Primary School pupils from Belfast, Olivia Johnston and Esme Falls in second and third place respectively.

Sarah Jackson from St Bride's Primary School, Belfast, came in first place in the penultimate girls' race of the Round, with Nell Whitehead from Knockbreda Primary Belfast in School, second place and Sophia Doris from Our Lady of Lourdes Primary School, Belfast, placing in third.

Teams of six entered the girls' and boys' races and collected points for their school to compete in the second round, with the hopes of qualifying for the final which is set to take place on 28TH of Feb 2025 at Mallusk Playing fields.

The top three boys' teams were Stranmillis Primary School, Belfast, Bride's Primary School, Belfast and Antrim Primary School, whilst the top three girls' schools were St Bride's Primary School. Moneynick Primary School, Antrim and Victoria Prep Primary School, Belfast.

HISTORY OF COUNTY ANTRIM HIGH SHERIFF REVEALE

The history of the Co. Antrim High Sheriff is being revealed in a brand-new exhibition which has opened at the Lisburn Museum.

The exhibition includes a range of materials compiled by the current post holder Mrs Patricia Perry which helps explain the history as well as the modern-day responsibilities of the

The office of High Sheriff is an ancient one dates back nearly 1,000 years, making it the oldest secular office in the United Kingdom. Each county or city borough appoints a High Sheriff as the monarch's judicial representative. The role has changed considerably over the years and is now an honorary appointment.

The exhibition explores the history and role of the High Sheriff of County Antrim. It also considers how the ancient office has evolved the centuries

and what its modernday responsibilities include. The artefacts on display include the old ceremonial uniform of the High Sheriff, last worn by Sir William Moore in 1964

The Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum is the final host of this travelling exhibition which runs to 31 January 2025.

Mayor, Cllr Kurtis Dickson, said: 'This wonderful travelling compiled exhibition, by the current High Sheriff, Mrs Patricia Perry, explores the fascinating history of the office she currently holds. The High Sheriff presided over the Grand Jury, a form of local government that predated the establishment of our local council system. As elected representatives, it

is important to recognise contribution and historic links between the High Sheriff and the modern, democratic system

government.' Cllr Jonathan Craig, Chairman of LCCC's Leisure & Community Wellbeing Committee, said: 'One of the High Sheriff's most important jobs is the proclamation of the new monarch. We saw this in 2022 with the sad passing of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. It was the High Sheriff of County Antrim who proclaimed at Antrim Castle Gardens

the accession of our new monarch, King Charles III. I would like to express my Committee's thanks to the High Sheriff for the generous loans to the museum which made this exhibition possible.'

The exhibition is open Monday to Saturday. 9:30am - 5pm.

JV Allister writes about the perils for badgers in Winter

It's been a while since I saw a badger, at least a live one, and thankfully winter is the season when they are less likely to travel far and become roadkill, although it will not be long until mating season, a time for travel and fatal jeopardy.

Badgers are animals, living in mixed sex 'clans' of between four and eight individuals in their home, known as a sett, which is usually dug under a large tree, with a series of tunnels leading to sleeping chambers, and often with many entrances and exits. They are very particular about bedding, regularly kicking out and replacing leaves, which helps reduce the build-up of parasites.

They are also particular about where they deposit faeces, being the only animals other than humans to dig latrines, often located on the edge of their territory, although possibly more to do with cent-marking clan and mating status rather than hygiene

Unlike some mammals. they don't hibernate in winter, but become less active, entering what's called a torpid condition when they sleep a lot, even lowering their body temperature to conserve

winter is when their cubs are born, responsibilities placing on the females (known as sows; males are boars) to feed and protect their young. You see, while badgers mate at almost any time of the year, but particularly in spring and early summer, because of unusual reproductive technique known as delayed implantation, they have only one litter a year, born in the worst of winter weather in January or February, but safe and



warm underground. The cubs will not appear above ground until April or May by which time their parents and clan relations be out foraging, possibly mating, continuing the cycle of annual badger life.

As with most wildlife Northern Ireland, badgers are vulnerable. because which developments damage or obliterate their

roads which cross ancient tracks; as as 50,000 are killed on roads each year in the UK, more than any other native

And sadly, there are still antisocial criminals in our society who regard so-called badger baiting by dogs as 'sport'.

But hopefully at this

time of the year the adults and cubs will be mostly safe in their warm beds, gently snoring. JVA.





NEW YEAR SLIMMING WORLD START GAVE NATASAHA CHANCE FOR REAL CHANGE

Natasha has lost over 8 stone and is feeling good! Here she explains how her local (Trinity) Slimming World Group became the secret to her success.

In Northern Ireland 65% of adults are either living with being overweight or obesity. Males (43%) had a greater tendency to be liv-ing with overweight than females (33%) and around a quarter of children aged 2 - 15 are either living with overweight or obesity.

In March 2024 I joined a gym. I didn't have a clue what I was doing so signed up for a number of classes which were so helpful and a great way to meet people. I also trained with a personal trainer for 6 months because I really started to enjoy the gym and wanted to learn more about building muscle while losing fat.

Before I joined Slimming my activity was little to none whereas now I'm at the gym for 3 sessions per week nd walking on my treadmill at home for a few minutes throughout the day.

optimising plan is great. There is so much variety. it makes me feel so much fuller and gives me way more energy than my previous food choices. I can still have chocolate and takeaway food. Previously my breakfast would have been

toast with butter or nothing. Now it's fruit, yogurt and granola or a wrap or sand-wich. In the past for lunch I often would have bought a shop sandwich and a chocolate bar. Now lunch is an egg wrap with chicken and salad or leftovers from the previ-ous nights dinner. Dinners used to be processed foods, frozen pizza/takeaway pizza with snacks of more chocolate, sweets, crisps and more toast with butter. Now I'm cooking a healthy chicken curry, a pasta bolognese, or making my own Slimming World friendly pizza. Snacks now are fruit, yogurt,

I have spent most of my life being overweight and never did I think when I joined than in less than 2 years I would have lost over 8 stone eating the way I am and exercising. People I haven't seen in a couple of years don't recognise me and I have had some strange conversations explaining to old friends that it's actually

Attending my Slimming World group at Trinity each week is what got me there. I could never have done this on my own. The accountability of the weekly group

the encouragement of my Consultant and like minded fellow members I was able to stay committed each week. I still find myself having urges to binge eat and even if I do overindulge I will face the scales and get straight back onto the plan.

I recently started help ing out in our groups social team which has been great to keep me motivated and meeting all the members.

I am very close to my chosen target weight and am feeling so good about myself and what I have achieved.



Tourism NI welcomes innovative proposal for Treetop Walk in Co Down

Castlewellan Forest Park is being investigated as the potential location for Northern Ireland's first ever Treetop Walk.

alongside Newry, Mourne and Down District Council.

"The success of our Treetop Walk Avondale in Co Wicklow shows the potential for this type of tourism attraction, and we believe it would bring many benefits to the local area and surrounding region."

"Remember, if you slip up one day don't be too hard on yourself, just carry on later in the day or the next day with your target in mind – don't wait until the next week to get back on track. Following these tips is a great way to get started on the journey to living a healthier life."

EX-COP'S TOP DRIVING TIPS FOR THE SNOW

A former long-serving police officer who is now Chief Riding Examiner for advanced driving and motorcycling at the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA), has shared advice to keep the public safe when travelling in difficult weather.

With over 30 years of experience, Andy Nixon has seen firsthand the pitfalls that drivers often face in disruptive weather.

Andy's Top Five Tips

1. Be ready for anything yourself and pack for the worst. Just in case you get held up in the cold, pack extra layers of clothing, a shovel to help you dig yourself out of sticky situations and sustenance, such as warm drinks or soup to keep you

going."
2. Take your time.

"Don't accelerate too hard or fast - stopping distance in ice and snow is around 10 times longer than it is in dry conditions. Take it steady and drive at a gradual, measured speed so it gives yourself time to react.

"When stopping, brake gently, and avoid sudden or harsh braking as this may cause the vehicle to skid.

possible, away in second gear by slowly releasing the clutch; this will stop the wheels from spinning. Nowadays, some automatic vehicles are fitted with a winter mode for starting

3. Check car components. "A decent tyre depth of at least 1.6mm (Legal limit) is vital to reduce the risk of skidding, and clean, functioning lights are essential - even one headlight not working can



dramatically increase the chance of a collision.

"It is important to make

sure your wiper blades are not split and clear screen properly

sometimes wipers may be frozen to the windscreen which may cause them to split if turned on so make sure you free them from the glass first before "Finally, using them. don't take off if you don't have enough fuel for your journey, as you don't want to break down in wintry conditions.

4. Keep windows clear. "Make sure windows are completely from snow and before you start don't vour journey; just clear a peephole! Leave the house slightly earlier if necessary to make sure this is done. Remember: it is illegal if you are not able to clearly see out of your front windows. Always keep a scraper in your vehicle in case a frost buildup returns."

5. Is it urgent?

"The most important thing is to ask yourself whether you need to make the journey - is it worth

the risk of driving in ice or snow? Sometimes trips are unavoidable, but if it can wait or if you're concerned about whether you feel confident to drive, delay the trip if possible."





HOW TO PROTECT YOUR HOME FROM LEAKS AND BURSTS


